


Our Higher Education programmes will elevate your learning – helping you to achieve greatness, maximise your opportunities, realise your ambitions and truly make a difference to your future.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Our entry requirements vary depending on which programme you choose. Usually, you should have already achieved, or be working towards A-Levels, a BTEC or equivalent qualifications.

Ideally you should **apply by 15 January** to have the best chance of being offered a place. However, we can accept applications after this date.

ACCESS TO HIGHER EDUCATION





If you've been away from education for some time or didn't quite achieve your college qualifications, an Access to Higher Education programme will give you the confidence and skills to take that next step to start a degree or equivalent university-level programme.

You'll receive ongoing support to help you achieve your goals and depending on your circumstances, may be entitled to an Advanced Learner Loan to help towards the cost of your programme.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You'll need a good level of English and will usually need your GCSE maths and English qualifications. However, if you don't meet these requirements, during your interview we can discuss your options.

Mum of two, Muna Omar successfully completed an Access to Higher Education Business programme and went on to study a Degree in Economics at Aston University in Birmingham.






ACCESS














ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES

FEES AND FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Higher Education Programmes

Our programmes are generally cheaper than other university-level courses. The cost of our full-time Higher Education programmes is between £5,225 and £6,000 a year, and depending on your circumstances you may be eligible to study for free.

You'll be able to apply for loans to help with tuition fees and living costs. The two main loans available are a Tuition Fee Loan and a Maintenance Loan. There are other grants available too.

TUITION FEE LOAN

As a full-time learner, you are entitled to a Tuition Fee Loan of up to £9,250 each year to cover your fees (this doesn't depend on your household income). You won't have to pay this back until you've completed your programme and your salary is over the current threshold set by the government.

There are some eligibility criteria you must meet to qualify for a Tuition Fee Loan:

Your programme must be in the UK and be a HND, HNC, Foundation Degree or First Degree.

- ► It must be your first Higher Education qualification.
- You can only apply if you're a UK national or have settled status.
- You must normally live in England
- You must have been living in the UK for 3 years before starting your programme.

MAINTENANCE LOAN

Full-time learners can claim a
Maintenance Loan to help with living
costs. The table below shows the
maximum you can claim. The amount you
receive is means tested and based on your
household income.

Living at home	Up to £8,610
Living away from home (outside of London)	Up to £10,227
You spend a year of a UK course studying abroad	Up to £11,713

You won't have to pay this back until you've completed your programme and your salary is over the current threshold set by the government.

CHILDCARE GRANT

The Childcare Grant helps with up to 85% of your childcare costs if you have dependent children under 15 (under 17 if the child has special educational needs) in registered or approved childcare. You can get up to £193.62 a week for one child or up to £331.95 a week for 2 or more children, depending on your household income. This doesn't have to be paid back.

PARENTS' LEARNING ALLOWANCE

The Parents' Learning Allowance is to help with programme-related costs if you have dependent children. You can get between £50 and £1,963 a year depending on your income and the income of your dependents. This doesn't normally have to be paid back.

ADULT DEPENDANTS' GRANT

The Adult Dependants' Grant can help you if you have an adult who depends on you financially. You can get up to £3,438 a year depending on your income and the income of your dependents. This doesn't have to be paid back.

DISABLED STUDENTS' ALLOWANCE

Disabled Students' Allowance is available to learners who incur additional costs because of a disability, long-term health condition, mental health condition or specific learning difficulty. How much you're entitled to depends entirely on your circumstances. This doesn't have to be paid back. We'd advise applying for your Disabled Students Allowance as soon as you've accepted onto a Higher Education programme.

Access to Higher Education Programmes

If you're aged 19-23 years old and haven't achieved a full Level 3 qualification you won't need to pay to study an Access to Higher Education programme. Otherwise our Access programmes cost between £3,022 and £3,384, plus £94 for your exam*.

ADVANCED LEARNER LOAN

Depending on your circumstances you may be able to apply for an Advanced Learner Loan to cover the cost of your Access programme. Advanced Learner Loans don't depend on your income and don't need to be paid back until you've completed your programme and your salary is over the current threshold set by the government. We advise applying for an Advanced Learner Loan as soon as you know you've been accepted onto a programme.

APPLICATION TO TIMELINE

MAY TO SEPTEMBER

Now is the time to start researching courses and attending Open Events.

SEPTEMBER

UCAS applications open.

DECEMBER

You college or sixth form will usually now check your application and add any references before submitting your form to UCAS.

MANUARY

UCAS application deadline. You can still apply after this date but it's advised to submit your application as early as possible.

FEBRUARY TO MAY

Now's a good time to start looking into your finance and support options.



MAY

Use UCAS Track to view your offers from the education providers you've applied to and see if your application has been successful.

UJUNE

Now's the time to reply to your offers from the education providers on UCAS Track.

AUGUST

You'll be invited to enrol onto your programme.

21 AUGUST TO SEPTEMBER

Clearing is open. If you haven't yet applied for a programme or didn't quite achieve the results you were expecting, you can give us a call to apply for a last-minute place or see what other programmes are available for you.

SEPTEMBER
