

FOREWORD FROM THE CHAIR

It is a privilege to welcome you to our Annual Review for the 2022/23 academic year. Coventry College has continued to go from strength to strength with significant improvements in its financial health and the student experience.

This progress has been formally recognised by the FEC (Further Education Commissioner) and the ESFA (Education, Skills and Funding Agency) with the college being removed from its 'Post Intervention Monitoring Support' status.

Once again, the college has been ably led by CEO and Principal Carol Thomas and her executive team, who have continued to drive the required culture change in the college to move us closer towards achieving a world-class teaching and learning offer. In addition to the two Vice-Principals, Gemma Knott and Patrick Geary, the executive team has been further strengthened this year with the appointment of Rob Moore as Chief Finance and Operating Officer.

Ofsted inspected the college during the year and whilst the overall grade has remained unchanged, there was clear recognition of the positive progress that the college has made across many areas. The most significant challenge from the inspection was in the area of apprenticeships, which consequently

means these will not form part of Coventry College's offer in the near future. The board believe this will allow Carol and her team to focus their efforts on delivering the highest quality of teaching across the college's core offer.

In line with statutory expectations for all further education colleges, the Corporation Board commissioned an independent review of governance. The review provided further assurance that the quality of governance at the college is strong and this is a testament to the commitment of my fellow governors on the board and our highly-skilled Head of Governance, Kay Kavanagh. The board continues to develop through its Governance Action Plan and its ongoing benchmarking against the Code of Good Governance.

One of my personal highlights of this year was being able to join Louise Bennett OBE (Deputy Lieutenant of the West Midlands) and Corin Crane (Chief Executive of the Coventry and Warwickshire Chamber of Commerce) to celebrate the Royal Coronation at the college. The day showcased the diversity and talent within the college community.

As in previous years, our over-arching strategic priorities will continue to be focused on ensuring there is a consistent high quality learning experience for all our students all as well as ensuring that the college is financially sustainable. This focus will ensure that Coventry College remains at the heart of the Coventry community for many more students, for many more years to come.








INVESTING IN OUR FUTURE

Coventry College has been working with several partners and stakeholders over the course of the last year to diversify its income streams, innovate its provision and secure its future.





Commercial fit-out specialists Inside Limited have been appointed to lead construction on Coventry College's new electric vehicle and retrofit centre. The new facility will be the first of its kind in Coventry and Warwickshire.

The £1 million works, funded through the Government's Strategic Development Fund, will help to deliver the new state-of-the-art centre to provide specialist training to students and the wider workforce.

As a college, we are extremely proud to be part of the Coventry community and are committed to creating positive changes and opportunities for the community and city.



Coventry College's creative media students helped to shine a spotlight on the work of one of the official suppliers to the Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games.

Five of the college's students were selected to work with Bristol-based technical production specialists SLX, to take part in an industry experience placement after the company was chosen to be the event's official broadcast lighting provider.

The Level 3 creative media learners were tasked with producing behind-the-scenes social media content of SLX's work in a bid to attract future talent and clients for the business.

- The Governing Board is supported by an open, informed and enthusiastic Principal and Chief Executive.




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- We're looking forward to starting our new employer responsive qualifications and training programmes in Retrofitting, Insulation and Electric Vehicle Technology, to meet the needs of the new Local Skills Improvement Plan.
